Unit Description

In conjunction with a thesis supervisor, students in Research Thesis 1 will develop a research question and embed this research question within the current literature, develop testable hypotheses and propose an appropriate methodology (including participants, measures and procedures). Students will develop adequate statistical justification for complete data analysis of the thesis project, describe all possible ethical issues associated with psychological research and determine which ones apply to their thesis and how they will satisfy ethical requirements. Students must complete appropriate documentation for ethics and achieve ethical clearance of proposed research. Students will practice effective verbal and written communication of concepts and research in psychology.
